It's a trying time, as the church seeks to rebuild and find ways to support its congregation in these tough circumstances. May 23, 1958 – April 2, 2026

It is with great sadness that we share with our HCM supporters the passing of Dr. Delilah Stephens on April 2, 2026.

Dr. Stephens was an extraordinary physician who faithfully served as the team MD on numerous medical mission trips to Haiti. Whenever a need arose, she responded without hesitation—promptly requesting time away from her work as a hospitalist so she could serve. Caring for the people of Haiti was not just something she did; it was a deeply held priority and passion in her life.

Double-board-certified in Internal Medicine and Pediatrics, Dr. Stephens was widely respected by colleagues and beloved by patients. She was also a gifted and patient teacher, generously mentoring new team members and students interested in medicine. She took others under her wing, answering questions with grace and walking them through procedures with kindness and skill.



Countless Haitian patients were touched by her compassionate care, and her impact reached far beyond the clinics she served. Her legacy will live on through the many lives she influenced—both in the United States and in Haiti.
