A Note from our Board

As we look ahead to 2021, the Board of Directors of Haitian Christian Ministries is thankful for God's provision and ongoing faithfulness as we serve the people of Northern Haiti. We would also like to thank each of you, our supporting churches and faithful supporters, for all you continue to do to meet the physical, education, and, most importantly, spiritual needs of our Haitian brothers and sisters. 2020 was a hard year for all of us. But it has been especially hard in Haiti where meeting one's most basic needs of food, clothing, and shelter are a daily battle. God has clearly interceded in that country by providing some protection from the Covid-19 virus. What was expected to be a devastating outcome for this impoverished country has actually been much better than anyone could have expected. While the numbers for Haiti on the John's Hopkins website are certainly underreported, news from the ground in Haiti confirms there is much less sickness and death there than in many developed countries. Haiti's population skews to the younger end of the age spectrum which seems to also be in their favor. Praise God for his protection, provision, and providence!

While we don't know what 2021 will bring, we look forward to the time when mission trips can again take place bringing medical teams, leadership conferences, Vacation Bible School, construction teams, and house builds to our friends in Northern Haiti. We will continue to monitor the situation here in the US as well as on the ground in Haiti to determine when the right time is to resume these types of activities. Meanwhile, life on the HCM campuses moves ahead and lives continue to be changed through our churches, schools, and medical clinic. Our churches are open for Sunday services to allow our people to come together safely to worship our Lord and Savior and support one another during these trying times. Our schools are open for daily in person instruction and the students continue to receive a daily hot lunch as they always have. Our medical clinic has remained open throughout this past year to serve the sick, pregnant, and injured, as well as to conduct routine health screenings.

One project we want to highlight that has been ongoing the past six months is the completion of our new modern restroom facilities on our Pillatre campus. This has been a huge need for a while now and it is great to see this project come to fruition due to the generous donations of our supporting churches and individuals. We will have flush toilets and sinks for use by our 1,500 students, faculty, and support staff. The finishing touches are being put on that project this week.
