# Update from the Board

As a Board, we are committed to standing with Pastor Bob and his family to continue to minister to the physical and spiritual needs of the people of Pillatre and Northern Haiti. They need us more than ever and we are unwavering in our commitment to being a beacon of light in a dark world. We pray that during these challenging times that more people will have their hearts softened to hearing the redeeming message of Jesus Christ and come to saving faith by surrendering their lives to Him. We pray we can continue to find medications locally for our medical clinic to provide health care to a community where most hospitals have shut down. We pray we are able to get our food container from Midwest Food Bank out of customs in Cap Haitian and safely to our Pillatre campus, so we have food for our ministry staff and students as food becomes more difficult to find every day. We pray that fuel can once again flow through the country to allow the population to be able to move around and gain some level of normalcy. The situation is Haiti is about as dire as it has been in a very long time and can feel overwhelming. Thankfully, we serve a God bigger than all of it, so we need to petition Him for a breakthrough.

We are focusing on some construction projects during this time to further secure the HCM campus as well

as Pastor Bob's home. We feel things are relatively safe in Pillatre but want to make sure we have good plans in place to further secure our facilities and Pastor Bob's home in the event the situation further deteriorates. Church services and activities have continued, and the medical clinic continues to operate. Schools have been closed at the direction of the Haitian government as well as the inability of teachers to get to our campus due to the fuel shortage and roads being impassable. Through your continued support, we are able to pay our teachers and staff. Things are very challenging in Haiti right now, so we definitely need the prayers
