On October 25th, our kids from HCM schools showed up for a great day of eating together and received some packages of Tender Mercies to eat with their families. Despite all the turmoil you have been hearing about in Haiti, our God never stops and HCM has not stopped.



We wanted to share some more recent highlights of how God continues to move in our midst. Our pastor in Longues was blessed with a motorcycle to allow him to do God’s work in his area. A food center was opened at Difou and 50 kids are being fed every day. The roof of Boukan Michel’s church was covered

with metal panels by some volunteers of Welcome Home Haiti. Our teachers in the entire ministry were paid even though we are not allowed to have our school open. Bathrooms at Breda 2 and Difou were built. We also purchased land for Breda 2 and additional land for Haut Dehaine.

Although most schools are not in session due to government restrictions, our two 9th grade classes and our 12th grade students are attending classes and are being fed a hot meal daily. We are prayerful and hopeful that all classes will soon resume along with daily meals for students. If classes cannot resume the week of December 5th, the plan is to resume early in January. We are planning a Christmas party for the students thanks to approval by the board for funds to make that happen.





Package reminder

While we know this is normally a time that sponsors will send Christmas packages to students and others, we are making the difficult decision to request you not do so right now. It is not only a dangerous trip for anyone to get to the airport due to roadblocks, but also very expensive. As previously mentioned, fuel is extremely difficult to come by, running upwards of \$35 a gallon on the black market. We know this seems like a time where sending supplies and gifts is more crucial than ever, but it really is best to hold sending those packages. We will let you know once we believe it is ok to resume sending packages once again.
